Significant Centenaries

Women's Right to Vote

A major anniversary in the history of democracy in Great Britain and Ireland is: the 100th anniversary of women's right to vote. The introduction of the *Representation of the People Act in 1918* meant that women over the age of 30, property owners and graduates from British universities were entitled to vote in parliamentary elections for the first time. The same Act gave the vote to all men over the age of 21. The law was extended ten years later, in June 1928, to include all women over the age of 21.

The End of the First World War

2018 is the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. *The November 1918 Armistice*, which took effect on 'The Eleventh Hour of The Eleventh Day of The Eleventh Month', ended the four-year conflict and marked a victory for the Allies.

The Spanish Flu outbreak

2018 marks 100 years since the start of one of the deadliest pandemics in human history. The outbreak of Spanish influenza in March 1918 signified the start of a global pandemic: some 500 million people became infected over the following years, with an estimated death toll of at least 50 million and perhaps as many as 100 million deaths in total.

Notable Centenaries

End of World War I

World War One was one of the deadliest conflicts in the history of the human race, in which over 16 million people died. The total number of both civilian and military casualties is estimated at around 37 million people. The war killed almost 7 million civilians and 10 million military personnel.

Germany formally surrendered on November 11, 1918, and all nations had agreed to stop fighting while the terms of peace were negotiated. On June 28, 1919, Germany and the Allied Nations (including Britain, France, Italy and Russia) signed the *Treaty of Versailles*, formally ending the war.

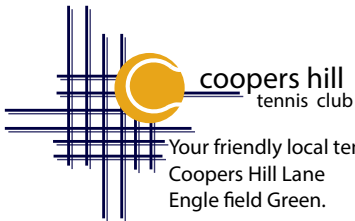

Notable Centenaries

Women Gain the Right to Vote

By 1914 it was clear women would eventually get the vote. Years of peaceful protest had convinced an increasing number of MPs to support female suffrage.

During the war many suffragettes gave up campaigning to support the war effort. When peace returned, Britain felt like a very different place.

Millions of British men fought in World War One, but a third of them had no right to vote. Women, who had proved they could do the same jobs as men in factories, offices and on the land, also had no representation.

The government knew it was time for a fundamental rethink as other countries including Australia had extended voting rights to women, making Britain look behind the times.

In 1918 the *Representation of the People Act* extended the vote to all men over 21, and to some groups of women over 30. However, this was not simply a reward for the vast sacrifice that women had made for the war effort.

Some historians have suggested the government intended these women to be a 'moderating' influence on radical younger male voters. It had the added advantage of taking the heat out of the female suffrage movement.

Still more than half of nation's women did not have a say in electing their government. Moderate campaigning would continue until 1928 when women were finally granted the vote on equal terms to men.

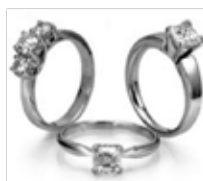

Notable Centenaries

Global Influenza Pandemic

The "Spanish flu" of 1918-20 killed somewhere between 50 and 100 million people worldwide. About 228,000 died in Britain. The virus is said to have originated in China, but it emerged in different places across the globe in the spring of 1918. The first reported case was Albert Gitchell, an Army cook at Fort Riley, Kansas, who woke up on March 11, 1918, thinking he had a bad cold - He didn't !

Overall, it killed between 2-4 percent of the world's population No one is sure where the Spanish Flu originated; or even if Private Gitchell was really the first victim.

So why is it called the Spanish Flu? That was a by-product of World War I censorship. Countries at war suppressed news about the flu to avoid alarming the public. Neutral Spain didn't censor the news and this may have created the mistaken impression that it had been hardest hit with an allegedly estimated 8 million deaths.

Besides being deadlier than most strains of influenza, the Spanish Flu posed the greatest risk to adults between the ages of 20 and 40; the typical age group of WW1 soldiers. The close proximity of the men in the trenches probably added to the ease with which the flu spread, especially as the war ended about 6 months later and the troops began departing to their respective homelands

Royal Holloway Links to the Suffragette Movement

What is now Royal Holloway, University of London was opened by Queen Victoria as the all-female Royal Holloway College in 1886 and did not admit male undergraduates until 1965.

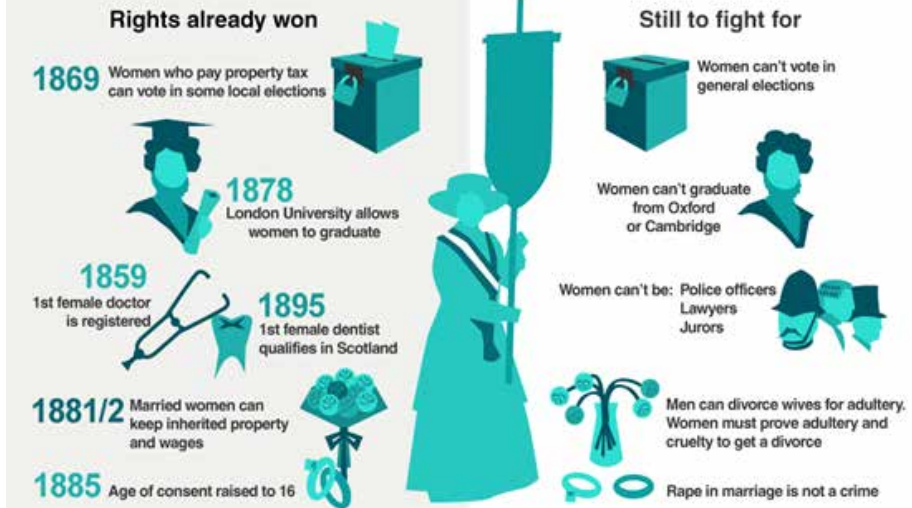
Several suffragettes studied there, including **Emily Wilding Davison**, who was fatally injured after she stepped out in front of the King's horse during the Derby on 4 June 1913

Others links to Royal Holloway and the suffragettes:

Beatrice Harraden (writer and regular contributor to *Votes for Women Journal*) studied at Bedford College in 1885. In 1929, Harraden was elected as a governor of Bedford College, which was later incorporated into [formal title] Royal Holloway & Bedford New College.

Helen Gwynne-Vaughan (néé Fraser), prominent botanist and women's activist, started her career at Royal Holloway College as a demonstrator for Margaret Benson in 1905. The following year she was appointed assistant lecturer: a position she held until 1907

The Death of Suffragette Emily Davison - Alternative Theory

Emily Davison was fatally injured at the Epsom racecourse during the 1913 Derby years ago under the hooves of the king's horse became to some as a brave martyr and to others irresponsible anarchist.

Recent digital analysis of the original newsreels appear to reveal that rather than trying to pull down the King's horse Anmer was in fact reaching up to attach a scarf or flag to its bridle and did not intend to kill herself.

Historians have suggested that Davison and other suffragettes were seen "practising" at grabbing horses in the park near her mother's house and that they then drew lots to determine who should go to the Derby. The fact that she was carrying a return train ticket from Epsom and had holiday plans with her sister in the near future seem to support the alternative theory.

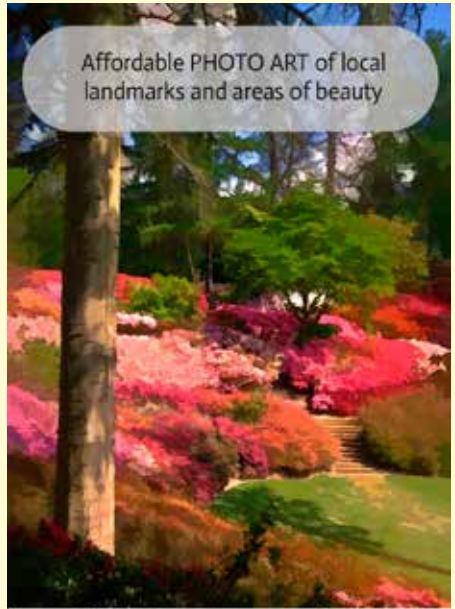
